Lincoln County Sheriff's Sergeant Cole Britton stopped in shortly before Mr. Padon and Community Engagement Director Alex Rohr with Triple Oak Power arrived at 9:20 a.m. Sergeant Britton stayed until 9:45 a.m.

Mr. Padon explained that while Triple Oak began its business in 2020, the CEO and other personnel were longtime veterans of the wind energy industry, familiar with this area. Since they are only in the preliminary stages and not ready to apply for permits, Mr. Padon said they merely wanted to introduce themselves and provide a brief project update. The Sentinel Wind Project is a foundational project being developed from the ground up. It carries an 8 GW portfolio that covers over 50,000 acres and twenty miles of Gen-Tie lines and partners with more than twenty landowners with whom they are working to secure easements.

Farm Service Agency County Executive Director Brenda Toft arrived at 9:30 a.m.

Mr. Padon noted that Colorado Springs Utilities remains the primary target for the power source, but they are open to exploring other potential utility companies. He also said that while Triple Oak tends to focus on wind energy, market demands might prompt them to branch out into solar energy and battery storage. When Mr. Ewing inquired about the Sentinel project, Mr. Padon stated that they are considering a wind farm of up to 500 MW. Still, wind resources, land negotiations, and turbine costs and demands will be the determining factors. He noted that the FAA has given preliminary approval for the pathway, which could also change; however, there is a significant demand for power in this area. Mr. Ewing mentioned a Road Use Agreement; Mr. Padon had met with Judd Kravig the previous day to discuss preliminary concerns. The commissioners advised the representatives to get involved with and support community activities and organizations, such as Karval's Plover Festival and local emergency services. Mr. Padon said they wanted to be good partners, and Mr. Jaques told him they must be honest and transparent with the landowners.

Mrs. Toft, Mr. Padon, and Mr. Rohr left at 9:40 a.m.

Sergeant Britton requested that someone notify the sheriff's department when the project proceeds, particularly regarding the storage of materials.

With no further business to discuss, Mr. Ewing adjourned the meeting at 9:50 a.m. The next meeting will be at 9:00 a.m. on July 17, 2025.
