The Board of Lincoln County Commissioners met at 10:00 a.m. on December 29, 2022. Chairman Doug Stone, Commissioner Steve Burgess, County Administrator Jacob Piper, Clerk of the Board Corinne M. Lengel, commissioner-elect Wayne Ewing, and Limon Leader reporter Stephanie Zwick attended. Commissioner Ed E. Schiffers and County Attorney Stan Kimble were absent and excused.

Chairman Stone called the meeting to order and asked Human Services Director Andrew Lorensen to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Lorensen provided financial reports, employee timesheets, Income Maintenance, Child Welfare, Adult Protection, and the director's monthly reports for the Board's review. He mentioned they'd see a substantial increase in the December SNAP payment compared to November's but again reminded the commissioners it would decrease considerably when the Public Health Emergency ends. Mr. Lorensen described the Home Care Allowance that Mr. Burgess asked about the previous month and said it depended on funding availability. He noted it was slightly misleading because the allowance wasn't strictly for home care.

Lincoln Community Hospital CEO Kevin Stansbury arrived at 10:15 a.m.

Mr. Lorensen presented a rental agreement for the Parenting Time/Resource Center he'd discussed with the Board, stating a Limon couple had graciously offered a completely furnished rental that would perfectly fit their needs. The commissioners had no problem with Mr. Lorensen signing the agreement. Mr. Ewing asked if the county would pay the rent and if it included utilities, and Mr. Lorensen told him that was what the Board had agreed to do. He thought the utilities were included in the lease but said he would have to check.

Before Mr. Lorensen left, Mr. Burgess moved to appoint him to the Senate Bill 94 Juvenile Services Board. Mr. Stone seconded the motion, which carried.

Mr. Stansbury apologized for missing the previous month's meeting and provided financial reports for the past three months. He briefly discussed the facility replacement and their efforts to find funding, stating that Lincoln Health should receive \$3 million courtesy of Senators Michael Bennet and John Hickenlooper. They plan to use the money to purchase new equipment to transfer to the new facility when built. Mr. Stansbury also mentioned the 2023 state legislative priorities for rural hospitals, specifically three proposed bills; The Saving Rural Colorado Hospitals and Copa Act of 2023, the County Hospitals Statutes Act of 2023, and the Cost Based Reimbursement Study Act of 2023. In the second bill, they want to change or clarify joint ventures, debt clarity, property ownership, and permissive hospital support.

Mr. Burgess asked if part of the change they sought was to relieve county commissioners of their duty to appoint hospital board members, but Mr. Stansbury assured him that was not the case.

Mr. Stansbury left, and Mr. Burgess moved to approve the minutes from the meeting held on December 19, 2022, as submitted. Mr. Stone seconded the motion, which carried.

Mr. Burgess moved to approve a county credit card with a \$1,000 credit limit for commissioner-elect Wayne Ewing. Mr. Stone seconded the motion, which carried.

Mr. Piper said they'd never formally adopted the changes to the drug and alcohol policy, so Mr. Burgess moved to amend Resolution #350, the Lincoln County Substance Abuse Policy. Mr. Stone seconded the motion, which carried.

AMENDED RESOLUTION #350 It was moved by Commissioner Burgess and seconded by Commissioner Stone to amend the resolution as follows:

WHEREAS, on December 29, 1995, the Board of County Commissioners of Lincoln County adopted the Lincoln County Substance Abuse Policy; and

WHEREAS, the Substance Abuse Policy requires revisions to meet with changes in federal regulations concerning urine drug testing and alcohol testing for safety-sensitive positions and to include only required information rather than being an all inclusive document on drug and alcohol testing.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Lincoln County that the attached Alcohol and Drug Abuse Policy (formerly Substance Abuse Policy) is adopted for use by Lincoln County effective as of this date.

Updates to the personnel manual included the ethics and whistle-blower policies that Mr. Piper said were part of the grant policy adopted earlier in the year. Mr. Burgess moved to approve the Lincoln County Personnel Manual updates, and Mr. Stone seconded the motion, which carried.

Mr. Kimble had reviewed and approved the resolution to establish secure transport services in the county, and Mr. Piper said Yuma and Cheyenne counties had similar guidelines. Those counties also intended to charge \$600 for the three-year service license, with annual \$10 vehicle permit fees, which the commissioners found reasonable. Mr. Piper said the paperwork included the three-year license application, an annual vehicle permit application, a mechanical evaluation (performed by a mechanic), a vehicle inspection (done by a behavioral health provider), and a complaint form. He felt Centennial Mental Health might be the only entity possibly requiring the license. Mr. Piper would manage the license applications and lead the investigation if someone filed a complaint. However, he would have the authority to appoint someone in the field (such as the emergency manager) to help him with the complaint process, if necessary.

Mr. Burgess moved to adopt a resolution establishing Secure Transportation Services Permitting Regulations. Mr. Stone seconded the motion, which carried.

RESOLUTION #1084 It was moved by Commissioner Burgess and seconded by Commissioner Stone to adopt the following resolution:

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, LINCOLN COUNTY, COLORADO,
TO ESTABLISH SECURE TRANSPORTATION SERVICES PERMITTING REGULATIONS**

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Lincoln County, hereinafter referred to as the “Board” is given the authority as set forth within C.R.S. § 25-3.5-309, et seq, and the Code of Colorado Regulations, 6 CCR 1011-4, Standards for Secure Transportation Services, as such statute and regulations may be amended from time to time, the Board must set forth requirements for the inspection, licensure and operation of secure transportation services for individuals experiencing behavioral health crises, in order to ensure high-quality behavioral health transportation within Lincoln County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the aforementioned statutes and authority, the Board has drafted the attached Lincoln County, State of Colorado Regulations Concerning Licensing of Secure Transportation Services that shall take effect as of January 1, 2023.

NOW, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Lincoln County that Board hereby approves the Lincoln County, State of Colorado Regulations Concerning Licensing of Secure Transportation Services and that such regulations shall go into effect as of January 1, 2023.

Mr. Burgess reported meeting with Kevin Stansbury at the hospital on December 19, where they discussed the three bills they hoped to present to the legislature next year. He also talked to Bruce Walters about fuel pre-payment. Mr. Burgess attended the Economic Development meeting in Limon on December 21 and, while there, received word from Mr. Stone that they’d decided to close the courthouse and annex buildings because of the weather. December 22 produced snow and below-zero temperatures, and wind chill. They closed the landfill and put the Road & Bridge crew on standby. Robert Safranek sent him the information for the election security room, and Mr. Burgess passed it along. They had a quick Christmas dinner for the road crew on December 23, but the crew members were busy plowing roads and had to get back to

work. The road graders plowed snow on Christmas Eve. Mr. Burgess went to Genoa on December 27, where the road crew worked on equipment and changed transmission fluid in the road grader. He learned the blended fuel only worked properly to -5 degrees, which they attributed their problems to from the week before. Mr. Burgess stopped at the landfill and then went to Denver and ordered signs. On December 28, the road crew graded roads and prepared for more snow. Chris Monks called him about a road south of Genoa where there were rolls of carpet in the county right-of-way. Mr. Burgess also spoke with Sheriff Nestor about a vehicle he said he could get for free. Lastly, Mr. Burgess said they got snow again this morning, the road crew was back to plowing, and the commissioners agreed to a two-hour storm delay for the courthouse and annex.

Mr. Stone reported going by the Karval shop on December 22. It was so cold that he told the road crew to go home and be on call. He also checked a few roads. District 3 had their Christmas dinner on December 23, but Mr. Stone said they also had to get back to work, so the guys ate a quick meal and returned to plowing snow.

Mr. Kimble had sent his report to Mr. Piper, noting he'd heard from the attorney of the landowner charged with damaging a county road up north. The lawyer told him the landowner would pay the \$500 fine. The judge had already recused himself from the case, but Mr. Kimble said they would dismiss it when the county received the payment.

Mr. Piper reported receiving a call from a local merchant regarding the new bag fee effective January 1. They asked if the county planned to enforce the law and, if so, where to send the county's payments. The commissioners agreed they didn't want to do anything unless forced into it.

Mr. Piper had received a question from a county department regarding per diem and the tip allotment, but the commissioners didn't want to set a limit on tipping wait staff since the policy included it in the \$56 per diem.

Janitor Teena Ludwig asked to buy two new bagless vacuum cleaners, one for the annex and one for the courthouse, at \$220 each. The Board agreed to the purchase.

Mr. Piper and Mr. Lorensen attended the unemployment hearing the previous day for the person who wasn't a county employee. He reported that it might not be over because it didn't seem like the moderator made a decision when the meeting ended.

The group discussed Robert Safranek's Scope of Work for the election security room and when to send the bid request to the newspaper. Mr. Burgess suggested having a walk-through during the reorganization meeting on January 10. Mrs. Lengel said she would get it to the paper the following day.

There was no other business to discuss, so the commissioners approved the December payroll and final bills for the 2022 budget year.
